

Let me conclude with some questions that I might anticipate:

Does this mean that our church will soon have a capital campaign to raise extraordinary funds? The answer is that any serious sanctuary expansion will require some kind of capital campaign. No decisions have been made on financing, as we are still in preliminary steps working with the architect on needs and options. Financial decisions will have to be made, of course, and architectural plans will all come with a price tag.

Do we plan to move to a different location or build a new sanctuary? There are no plans for either of these. The assumptions guiding everything that we have done are that Second Presbyterian Church will remain at River and Rhett Streets and that we will continue to worship in our beloved historic sanctuary. What we are doing is seeing what can be done to expand our current sanctuary most effectively and efficiently.

Does this mean that other rooms or items will be reconfigured, moved, or removed? The answer is that we do not know exactly, but we do know that sanctuary expansion is very likely to affect other things. It is too early to speak more definitely, as we have just started to work with the architects.

I hope this lets you know what we are up to and why. Let me now solicit your prayers for this ambitious project. Our agenda is driven by nothing other than a desire to meet the requirements of what God is doing in and through our church, and our immediate aim is to increase the sanctuary seating. If you have any questions or input, please feel free to contact any member of the long-range planning committee. Thanks so much for your prayers, generosity and support. And praise the Lord for His blessings past, present, and future. We rely completely upon His grace and we desire His glory above all other things.

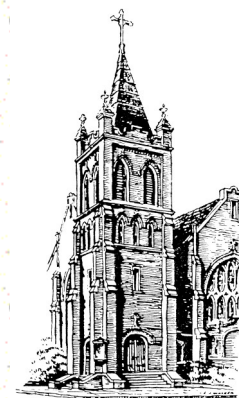

Letter From The Senior Minister Long Range Planning

A couple of years before I arrived as pastor in 2007, the elders convened a long-range planning committee to consider the resource and facility needs of the church in years to come. In light of increased growth in the last couple of years in our church, the elders reconvened this committee earlier this year. The long-range planning committee has since been meeting periodically to consider needs, options, and approaches for future growth in our church. The committee consists of the following church members: John Gray, Chairman, Melton Duncan, Nathaniel Johnson, Jill Mann, Leslie Martin, David Rainey, Robert Spears, Al Wills, and me.

Recently, at the recommendation of this committee, our church has secured the services of an architectural firm, McMillan, Pazdan, Smith, to develop a new site plan for our church. In short, this firm will offer us designs for renovations to expand the seating capacity of our sanctuary, as well as to develop plans for further renovation and/or construction, as needed. The architectural firm expects to have proposals for our committee available later this fall. After studying these proposals we hope to make a recommendation to the Session early in the new year. At present, we are submitting surveys on facility use and needs to the architectural firm. All ministry leaders in the church should have been contacted and provided with a survey to fill out. Also, any church member who desires to fill out a survey should contact a committee member and request a copy. Your input is important, however, these surveys need to be completed by September 2, 2010.

Why do we have this long-range planning committee and why are we asking an architect's services in offering us renovation options? The simple answer is that we may soon outgrow our facilities. Our membership is over 500 and our sanctuary holds about 325 people. This requires us to split our morning worship into two services. However, if we continue to grow numerically as we have been doing, it will not be long until we no longer fit in two services. Moreover, it is probably the case that our Sunday morning crowding is inhibiting growth. Therefore it has seemed prudent to us to explore options for expanding the seating. This also requires us, of course, to consider the need for other renovations and facility expansion to accommodate Sunday School classes, meeting spaces, etc. In short, as the Lord adds to our numbers we have to make provision to accommodate the growth.
